

Opportunity – First Nation Environmental Technician

Triton Environmental Consultants Ltd. (Triton) is currently seeking a **First Nation Environmental Technician** to support environment works during construction of a pipeline compressor station facility. This is a short-term contract position.

ROLE

This position will support environmental monitoring and wildlife biology-related tasks during compressor station construction activities. This position will report to the Operations Manager, while working under the direction of the Project Manager and Crew lead.

DURATION & SCHEDULE

- This is a short-term contract position with the potential to be extended. This position is scheduled to start April 2025 and end approximately November 2025.
- The planned field shift rotation is 2 weeks on & 2 weeks off, working 10 – 12 hrs daily. Please note that the shift field schedule could change and is determined by client project needs.
- Camp accommodations are provided, including private rooms, meals and laundry facilities. Transportation to and from camp shifts will be provided.

SKILLS & QUALIFICATIONS

- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Able to communicate effectively with co-workers and other contractors, and work as part of a team
- Being punctual and able to work in the field, including working outdoors and in remote locations
- Willingness to travel and be away from home and able to stay in employer provided accommodations
- Able to work a field rotational shift schedule which can include working up to 10 – 12 hours per day
- Being reasonably physically fit, able to conduct field work in all weather conditions (standing, walking, hiking, moving, bending, carrying gear, etc.)
- Valid driver's licence is an asset
- Required to successfully pass a standard drug & alcohol test, as a condition of project site employment
- Relevant safety related certification including WHMIS, First Aid, Bear Awareness, Construction Safety Training, and Transportation of Dangerous goods an asset – Triton can assist chosen applicant with obtaining this training

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist biologists with water quality, fish, wildlife, and vegetation assessments
- Support environmental monitoring of construction work activities
- Mobilize and maintaining field gear and equipment
- Support bird nest sweeps or fish and/or amphibian salvages, as a crew member
- Collect, compile, and report on data
- Attend project and safety meetings
- Promote safety culture and comply with safety protocols
- Work collaboratively with colleagues, operators, and contractors
